

# Driving Directions

There is parking on Dewey Street and behind the office. Please enter through the office entrance on New York Avenue which is the door to the right of the main house entrance. Please note that while there is accessibility to the office's back door with a ramp, there is one step which will prevent a wheelchair from entering. Therefore, if you are uncomfortable with this entrance, please advise as soon as possible and we will make arrangements to conduct the appointment at your home.

## **From the West**

1. LIE East or Northern State East to Seaford Oyster Bay Expressway North Route 135.
2. Get off at the 2<sup>nd</sup> to last Exit Jericho Tpke East Rt. 25
3. Travel on Jericho Tpke East until you get to the intersection of Jericho Tpke and Rt. 110 (Staples office supply is on the left) Make left onto Rt. 110 heading North.
4. Stay on Rt. 110 heading North, go underneath Huntington Train Trestle
5. You will pass Connell Funeral Home on your right and further down on your left will be an Outback Steak House/Home Depot shopping center
6. Continue North, passing the Huntington Rural Cemetery on your left.
7. On your right, you will soon see a large brown house with a wrap-around porch which has a large white sign that says ElderCare Resource Center.

## **From the East**

1. LIE West to exit 51, Deer Park Road North (Rt. 231) Go under Northern State Parkway overpass, then fork left onto Deer Park Road West
2. Continue on Deer Park Road West. Cross over Jericho Turnpike (Rt. 25), road name will change to Park Avenue
3. Continue North on Park Avenue. Make left onto Main Street Rt. 25A
4. Continue West on Main Street until New York Avenue Rt. 110. Make a left onto New York Avenue and travel South through one traffic light.
5. The office is one block South of that traffic light on the left hand side on the corner of Dewey Street and New York Avenue. The office is a large brown home with a wrap-around porch.
